How can we effectively work together along the supply chains – hooks and challenges

- Co-operation between different groups (climate, human rights, anti-lobby, anti-corruption, corporate-focussed, finance-focussed)
- Co-operation with groups in producing/transition countries (understand political context, don't come in like a space ship)
- Co-operation between people on the ground resisting and NGOs
- => use all this to counter the narrative of the „good and clean“ gas
- Reflect and discuss strategy (discuss alternatives/with the company, avoid the divide and rule game)

How can we effectively work together along the supply chains – hooks and challenges

- Political situation in producing and transition countries: challenge that can turn into hook (shrinking space for civil society, human rights abuses, repressive regime) EITI, situation in Turkey => harvest on opportunities
- Broader political situation: security of supply/diversification narrative (killing argument, which can get leaks with new developments)
- Address the financing (public and private), needs different approaches, length of securing financing is helping (every little protest in Italy helps), feed them with all new problems, scandals, delays
- Develop legal strategies

How can we effectively work together along the supply chains – hooks and challenges

- Address the bigger picture plans: energy strategies, projects of common interest (technical, crap consultations) this might kill some projects early on; mobilisation is most difficult when probably most could be gained through it
- Produce new evidence (methane leakages, amount of Azeri resources, declining gas demand, underuse of existing infrastructure)
- Develop new narratives, feed media with them
